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# Look at our next Fundraising Project!



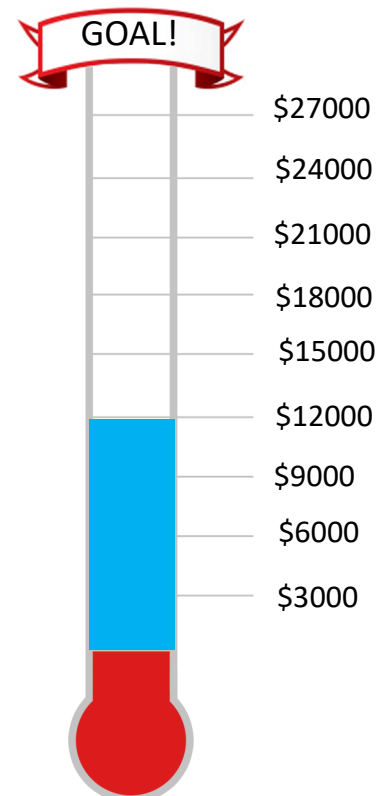
## New Playground Project
