St Johns First Aid

Yesterday, all students at Albert Street Primary School participated in the St John First Aid in Schools program—a free, age-appropriate initiative designed to equip children with essential first aid skills and confidence.

Delivered by professional trainers from St John Ambulance Victoria, the sessions were tailored to each year level. Younger students engaged with interactive storybooks and learned the DRSABCD action plan through fun chants and roleplay. Older students practiced placing someone in the recovery position and explored responses to emergencies such as snake bites and anaphylaxis.

This hands-on experience not only taught students how to respond in emergencies but also reinforced the importance of staying calm and seeking help. Each child received a certificate of participation.

We extend our gratitude to St John Ambulance Victoria for delivering this valuable program, which has reached over 1.4 million children across the state since its inception.

WHOLE SCHOOL SWIMMING

Forms have been sent home providing information on the Whole School *Compulsory* Swimming Program.

This program is now live on Sentral for you to give permission for your child to attend and payment forms need to be returned to the school by Friday 20th June.

If you have not yet returned your Swimming Pre-Program Survey please also send this in to the office as soon as possible.

This program provides opportunities for students to develop their swimming ability and knowledge of water safety to decrease the risk of drowning and injury when participating in water based activities.

School Saving Bonus reminder and allocation to school activities

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

The SSB can be used for uniforms and textbooks until Monday 30 June 2025.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a credit to use on school activities. However, the credit will not be available on your family account at our school until late July. To use any remaining SSB funds to cover the cost of school activities in July, please refer to the SSB online system and allocate the funds to school activities before 30 June 2025.



At the end of term 2 prizes will be awarded to the students who have filled up their booklets.


