If you are interested in having a memory of the school concert a huge range of photos taken during rehearsal have been placed on Facebook for you to access.

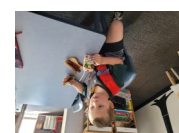

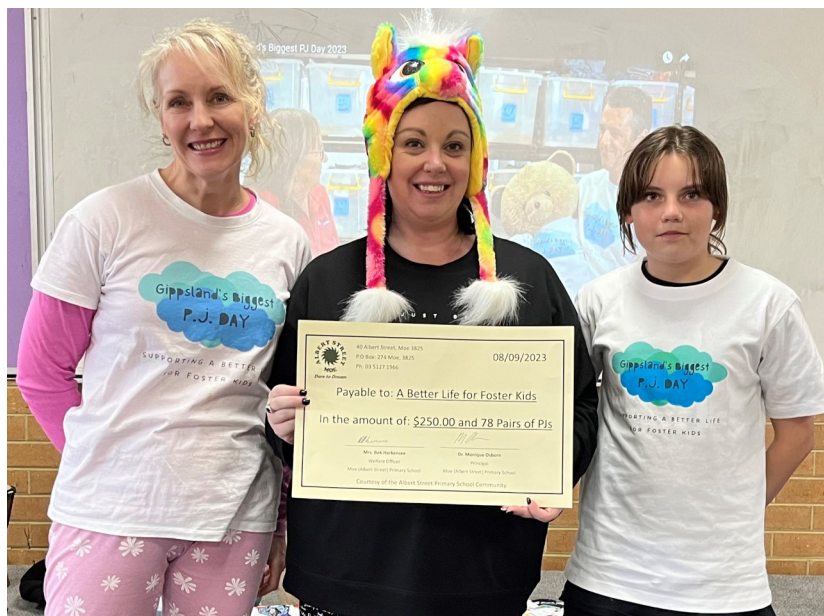
# Pyjama Day

### Sentral—Absences

Did you know you can notify the school of absences using the parent portal? Please ensure you load the absence or call the school prior to 9:00am if your child is absent. You can also load absences in advance if you have an upcoming event or appointment.

### Mobile Phones and Devices at Albert Street

Recently there have been a couple of instances at school where devices have been used inappropriately and school mobile phone device policy has not been followed. This has resulted in a review of the process and the following will be put in place to commence in Term 4. All devices (including mobile phones, smart watches and devices that can take an image) brought to school will be:

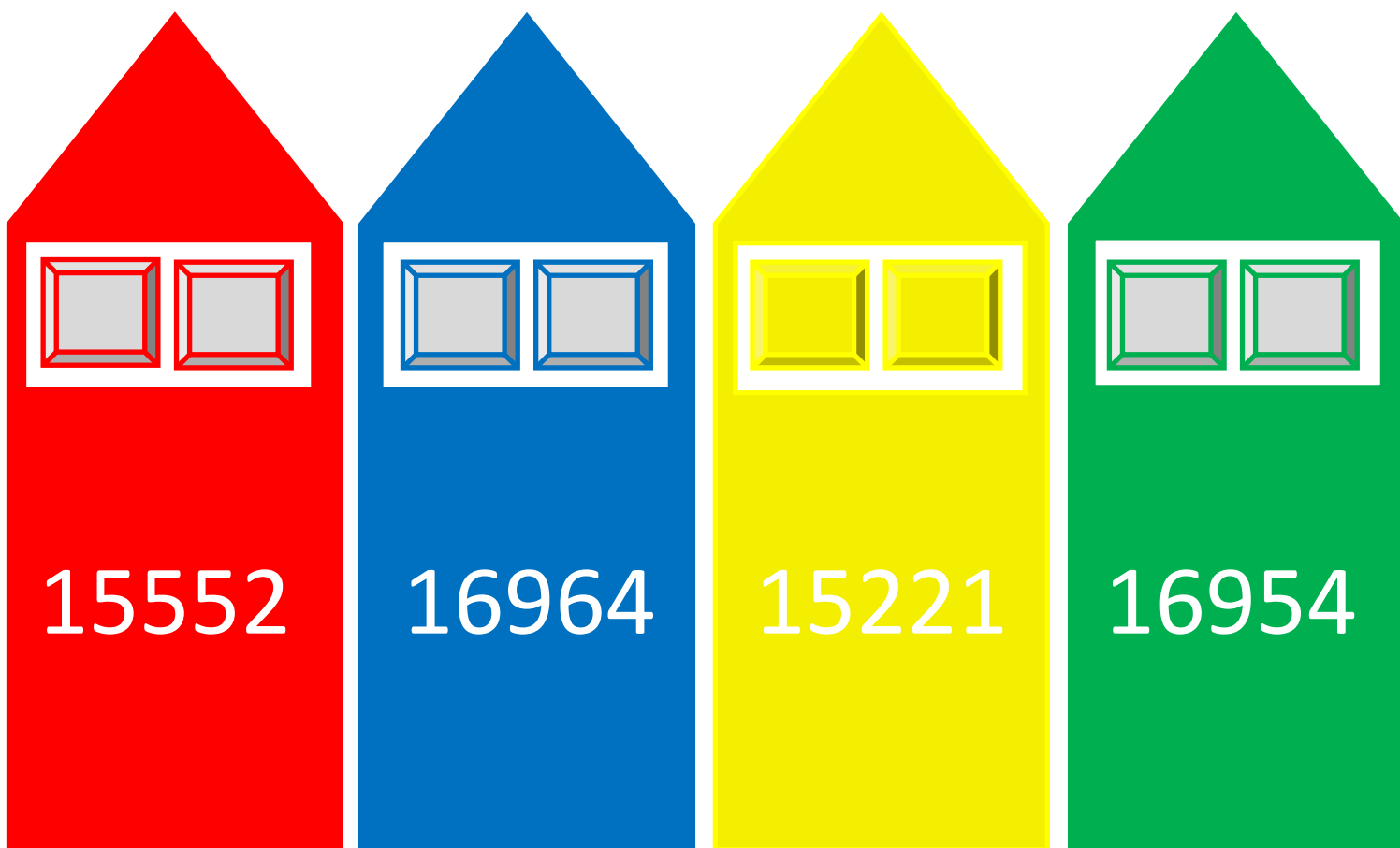
- Handed to the classroom teacher when the roll is marked in the morning or when arriving late, directly to the office
- The device will be stored in the students own snap lock bag and placed in a locked tin and stored at the office
- At the end of the day the device will be returned to the student
- Parents/Carers of students not adhering to the policy will be contacted to discuss these requirements.

We are asking parents/carers to also consider whether your child actually requires a device at school and if not essential, to leave devices at home. Your co-operation will ensure we adhere to child safe policy in keeping all kids safe at school.
