We are incredibly proud of our graduating students and wish them every success as they take the next steps in their learning journey. Year 6, you will always be part of our school story.
























#### Staff vs Students Bootball Showdown



If you were born between 1966 and 1992, you may have only had 1 dose of the MMR vaccine.

If you haven't had two doses, or you don't know, visit your GP or pharmacy.

No Medicare card is required to get a free state-funded MMR vaccine.
