FIRST YEAR MEDICAL STUDENTS

We welcomed Talia and Katrina, First Year Monash Medical Students, for a four week placement at our school.

NAPLAN CONGRATULATIONS

During the past year, our Annual Implementation Plan focus has been to improve the literacy outcomes of our students. A change in teaching methods as well as focussing on maintaining a safe and orderly classroom environment has led to some very pleasing year 3 and 5 NAPLAN results in reading and writing.

Our results are compared with other similar public schools in our Latrobe Network and across the State as well as all public schools across the State. In particular

- Year 5 Reading 71% of our students rank strong exceeding which is greater than similar schools at 56% and Latrobe Network at 66%. Our percentage is slightly lower than the State average of 74%
- Year 3 Writing- 67% of our students rank strong exceeding which is greater than similar schools at 60% across the State.
- Year 5 Writing- 71% of our students rank strong exceeding which is greater than similar schools at 52% and Latrobe Network at 62% and also at the State average at 72%

Well done to our years 3 and 5 students and staff.






This term breakfast club will only run on Wednesdays and Fridays

This lunch was generously provided by our Canteen Superstars, Heather and Rob, and we thank them for this amazing gift.


We encourage all of our school community to support the Canteen, which is open Fridays for lunch orders.


BOOK FAIR!!!
