- 3. Melt butter, sugar and honey together in a saucepan until frothy.
- 4. Add Corn Flakes and mix well.
- 5. Working quickly spoon into paper patty cases.
- 6. Bake in a slow oven 150°C for 10 minutes.
- 7. Cool.
