Out of 107 students present on Friday, 82 children walked or rode to school, whether in the school groups or just as their daily occurrence. This equates to almost 77% of our study body engaging in this activity.

There were approximately 7 staff, 20 families, 3 dogs, plus a member of the local Proactive Unit also in attendance, which means well over 1000 House points were awarded, not to mention 80 cups of hot choccy poured!

Sentral—Absences
