SCHOOL COUNCIL SUMMARY

Our last School Council meeting for 2026 was held this week. Well done to Junior School Council members Kailie-May and Jake (President) who presented their report and successfully negotiated support to fundraise for more sand pit toys in 2026. Jacob Hall, Student Engagement Leader, presented information on the Going Up Day format and the first week of term I so that students are fully aware of learning and behavioural expectations to ensure a continued safe and orderly learning environment. The school's Indicative Budget 2026 prepared by our Business Manager, Jen, was presented and approved. A fundraising report was presented, we currently have raised \$6,456.41, of which will be some will be used on updating playground equipment.

30 stamps= a hand ball


40 stamps= Latrobe leisure family pass
