


## Traffic School Bike-Ed Program

30 stamps= a hand ball


40 stamps= Latrobe leisure family pass

### Community Pantry



A reminder to all families that we have a Community Pantry that can be accessed by parents. Our pantry items are primarily provided by FoodBank and we welcome families to take what you need! The food items available include cereals, soups, fruit cups, spaghetti, baked beans, tuna, honey, vegemite, milk and bread (in freezer). We also have feminine hygiene items and toothpaste. Just around the corner we usually have fresh fruit such as apples, pears, and oranges.

There are also free books and second-hand uniform for \$3 each.

#### Upcoming Social Media Ban for Under 16s

The Victorian Government has announced that the new **social media ban for children under 16** will come into effect on **Wednesday 16th December**. This change is designed to support the safety, wellbeing and mental health of young people by reducing exposure to online risks, inappropriate content and social media pressure.

We understand that this change may raise questions for families, and many parents may be wondering how to navigate conversations and set up safe routines at home. Below are some helpful resources to support you during this transition:




