F-6 Swimming Program Monday June 30th -Friday 4th July

As we approach the commencement of our annual swimming program, I want to highlight the critical importance of every student participating in this essential component of our curriculum. Australia's identity is deeply intertwined with water, yet recent statistics reveal a concerning trend. Over the past summer, 104 individuals tragically lost their lives to drowning, underscoring the urgent need for comprehensive water safety education. Alarmingly, drowning remains the second leading cause of accidental death among individuals aged 5 to 24.

In response to these alarming figures, the Victorian Curriculum F–10 mandates swimming and water safety education for all students from Foundation to Level 10. By the end of Year 6, students are expected to demonstrate competencies outlined in the Victorian Water Safety Certificate, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to safely engage in aquatic activities.

At Albert Street Primary School, we are committed to delivering a comprehensive swimming program that not only fulfills curriculum requirements but also instils confidence and promotes lifelong safety habits. Our program is designed to be inclusive, ensuring that every student, regardless of their background or prior experience, has the opportunity to develop these vital skills.

We understand that some families may have concerns or face challenges regarding participation. Please be assured that we are here to support you. If you have any questions or require assistance, do not hesitate to contact the school office.

Let's work together to ensure our children are equipped with the skills they need to stay safe and enjoy the water confidently.

Early Departure from School – Process Reminder

As we move through the winter months, we understand that illness may occasionally require students to leave school early. We'd like to take this opportunity to remind our school community of the process for early departures from Albert Street Primary School:

- Only authorised individuals listed on a student's enrolment or as emergency contacts are permitted to collect a student from school.
- Parents/carers must arrive at the administration office to initiate the early departure.
- The student's class will be contacted, and the student will meet their parent/carer at the office with their belongings.
- Students must be signed out at the office using the electronic kiosk. Our friendly admin team is available to assist if needed.

School Saving Bonus reminder and allocation to school activities

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

The SSB can be used for uniforms and textbooks until Monday 30 June 2025.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a credit to use on school activities. However, the credit will not be available on your family account at our school until late July. To use any remaining SSB funds to cover the cost of school activities in July, please refer to the SSB online system and allocate the funds to school activities before 30 June 2025.


GAGA PIT FUNDRAISING PROGRESS


