— 3min ride/12min walk

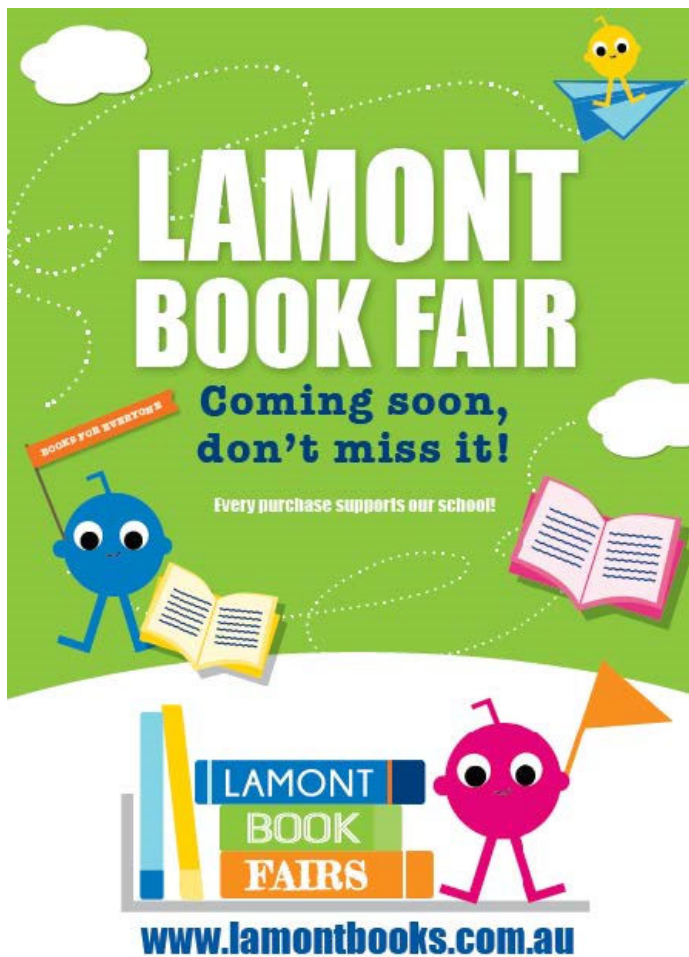
