The focus of this meeting was to consider the roles and responsibilities of the ASPS School Council in relation to Department of Education Governance Policy. We are incredibly proud of the way our students embraced the challenge and supported one another, and we look forward to what week two will bring.

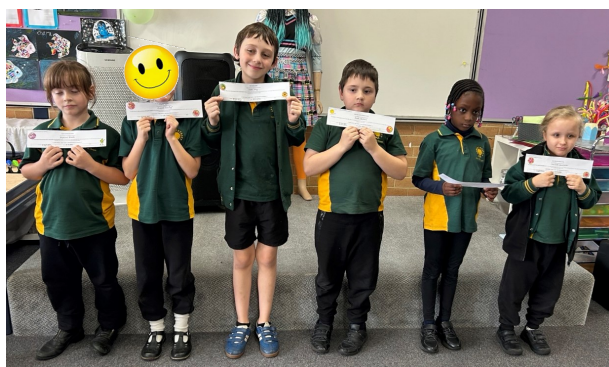

We are excited to be part of the **Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program**, giving our students the opportunity to learn about growing, harvesting, preparing and enjoying fresh, seasonal food.

Through our **Kitchen Garden Program**, students are involved in hands-on learning experiences in our school garden and outdoor kitchen. They learn where food comes from, how to grow and care for fresh produce, and how the ingredients they harvest can be transformed into delicious meals.

The program is about much more than gardening and cooking. Students develop practical life skills while building their confidence, teamwork, independence and understanding of healthy food choices. It also provides wonderful opportunities to connect learning across areas such as science, sustainability, mathematics, literacy and health.

One of the highlights is seeing students experience the complete **garden-to-plate journey**: planting a tiny seed, caring for it as it grows, harvesting the produce, preparing a meal and, of course, enjoying the results together!



YEAR 6 LOWANNA TRANSITION DAY

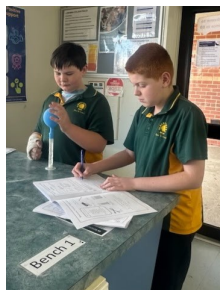
On Wednesday this week our Year 6 students had the opportunity to visit **Lowanna College** for a Transition Day, giving them a taste of what secondary school life will be like.

WILD WORLDS - SPECIAL EFFECTS PAINTING!

Foundation and Year 1 students have been getting wonderfully experimental in Visual Arts as they explore special-effects painting and printmaking processes to create their own 'Wild Worlds'. Rather than relying on paintbrushes, students are discovering how unusual tools, materials and movements can create exciting textures, lines, patterns, and effects.

So far, students have used marble rolling, dot-dabber splats and ink dribbling to create lush jungle backgrounds, and texture stamping for their tigers. For their underwater worlds, they used bubble-blowing paint to create watery blue backgrounds, straw-blown ink for seaweed and balloon printing for colourful fish.

This week, our young artists began their next Wild World - a bird flying through the sky - experimenting with feathers on Gelli plates and shaving foam printing. Through playful experimentation, students are learning that artists can roll, blow, dab, dribble, stamp and print to transform paint into all kinds of unexpected effects - and that sometimes the most exciting art comes from trying something new!

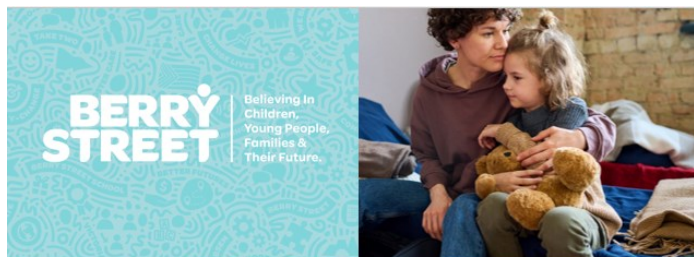

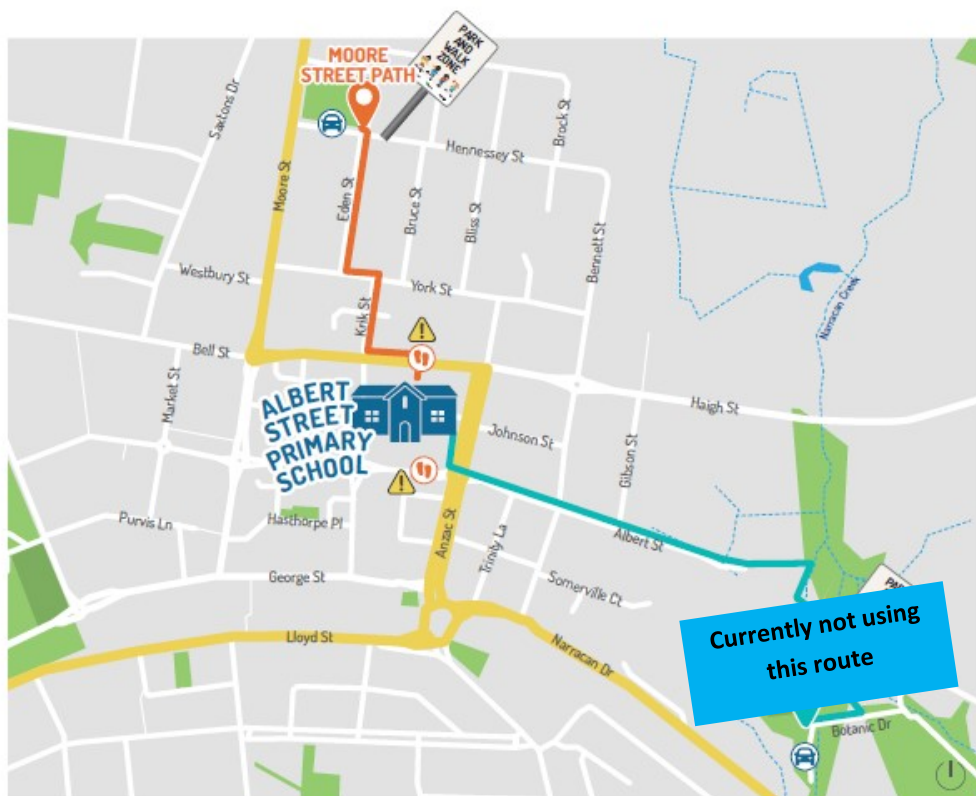
